- 2) Do not Iron or Tumbledry



# Paediatric Strap

Instructions For Use








The Paediatric Strap is designed specifically to secure the Paediatric Leg Bag to the leg.

The centrally positioned design and strong Velcro closure keeps the Paediatric Bag secure without hindering movement.

Important: Do not let the Leg Bag hang unsupported from the Catheter as this will cause urethral discomfort and trauma.

### **Before Use**


- 1) Measure the circumference of the leg (where the Paediatric Bag is going to be positioned) and ensure you have the right size strap from the table below
- 2) If the measurement falls between the two sizes, select the longer strap and cut to size



# Instructions For Use

- 1) Feed the strap through the eyelets at the side of the Paediatric Leg Bag (Diagram 1)
- 2) Ensure the silicone lines(1) are facing the skin
- 3) Wrap the strap around the thigh or calf in the desired position (Diagram 2)
- 4) Secure using the velcro tabs(2). Ensure the strap is not overtightened around the leg as this can affect circulation
